I hope you have had a lovely weekend and are ready for the week ahead.

## **ELSA**

As we prepare of Mental Health week, we thought it pertinent to share with you how our ELSA team work at Neston. We are lucky enough to have 2 trained ELSAs (Mrs Sykes and Mrs James) who provide additional support for our children when they need a bit of a boost. They provide 1:1 sessions or small group sessions. The programme usually takes place over 6 weeks, with each weekly session lasting approximately 45 minutes. Outcomes are carefully planned and monitored to develop skills and coping strategies that will help children to manage social and emotional demands more positively and effectively.

## What does an ELSA do?

ELSA's are specialist Teaching Assistants who have received special training from Educational Psychologists to support the emotional development of children and young people in school. ELSA work is not therapy. An ELSA's role is to help children learn to understand their emotions and respect the feelings of those around them and to provide the time and space for pupils to think about their personal circumstances and how they manage them. It is based on the view that all children are different and they should be nurtured according to their needs. Sessions are planned in advance and tailor-made to suit the needs of the children and to work on a wide variety of emotional or social difficulties such as:

- Emotional literacy
- Resilience
- Attachment
- Active Listening/Communication Skills
- Social/Friendship Skills Interventions
- Self-esteem
- Loss and Bereavement
- Family Separation
- Cognitive Behavioural Approaches
- Growth Mindset

As part of our Safeguarding procedures, we will contact parents of those children who are not present for registration.










Being in school at least 95% of the time or 180 to 190 days

attendance	
98%	Excellent attendance that will contribute towards excellent learning and progress.
96-97%	Good attendance that will contribute towards good learning and progress.
93-95%	Average attendance & monitored closely
80-92%	Below average attendance that may begin to have an adverse effect on learning and progress. The school will closely monitor the absences and reasons for them. The Educational Welfare Officer may become involved and a school attendance meeting may take place.
Less than 80%	Very poor attendance that will have a negative effect on learning and progress. The Educational Welfare Officer will become involved in supporting the family to improve attendance.



Please can we ask that you are considerate of our neighbours and cautious where you park at drop off and pick up times. This includes leaving the bus stop free for the school bus and not blocking the entrance to the school car park, as this is required at all times.

Please also be mindful that cars leaving the car park cannot always see out onto the road clearly.


