REPORTING ABSENCE


Please could we remind parents of the following procedures for reporting your child absent:-

attendance	
98%	Excellent attendance that will contribute towards excellent learning and progress.
96-97%	Good attendance that will contribute towards good learning and progress.
93-95%	Average attendance & monitored closely
80-92%	Below average attendance that may begin to have an adverse effect on learning and progress. The school will closely monitor the absences and reasons for them. The Educational Welfare Officer may become involved and a school attendance meeting may take place.
Less than 80%	Very poor attendance that will have a negative effect on learning and progress. The Educational Welfare Officer will become involved in supporting the family to improve attendance.







School Dinners



Please can we remind you that meals need to be ordered at least one week in advance.

The **booking deadline is midnight on a Wednesday** and a text is sent out at 6pm on Wednesday every week.

If you miss the midnight deadline, ParentPay will not allow you to book meals for the following week. You will still be able to order for subsequent weeks, with the option to book for the whole term, if you wish.

If you do miss the booking deadline, you will need to provide a home packed lunch for the whole of the following week.

Our kitchen orders the food and prepares the meals based on the number of dinners booked on a Wednesday. This helps to reduce food wastage and keeps costs down, which is especially important with the current economic climate.



Dear Parents / Carers

Industrial Action

As you will be aware from the national media, one of the teachers' union, NEU (National Education Union) is taking part in a regional programme of action in their ongoing dispute with the Government. I am writing to let you know that the planned dates for this strike action are as follows:

- Thursday 2nd March 2023
- Wednesday 15th March 2023
- Thursday 16th March 2023

I'm getting in touch to give you as much notice as possible that learning may be disrupted on these dates.

I will aim to let you know the impact of any action at Neston as soon as possible in order to give you the maximum possible notice should it be necessary to close the school. The decision around whether to keep the school open will be made after carefully considering the safety of staff and children. As some disruption is likely, we recommend that you start to consider making alternative childcare arrangements on the dates above.

We appreciate that this situation may be frustrating and ask that all members of our school community continue to treat each other with respect. We are working closely with representatives from the NEU to keep up to date with the situation, and I will inform you of the final arrangements as soon as possible.

Safer Internet Day at Neston!





On Tuesday the 7th February, we celebrated Safer Internet Day. Classes across the school took part in lots of activities to get them talking about what they do online. This year's theme was 'Want to talk about it? Making space for conversations about life online.'

KS1 and KS2 attended special assemblies that highlighted the importance of talking about what is good about spending time online but also that it is important to reach out to trusted adults if spending time online upsets or worries them for any reason no matter how small it seems.

Willow class played a board game about what they would say or do in different scenarios both online and offline.

Oak class read a story called 'Hanni and the Magic Window' and played a game of 'This or that' about whether they prefer online activities or offline.

Hazel class played a game of 'How well do you know me' and discussed what they should do if something upsets or worries them online.

Chestnut class created an A-Z list of activities they like to do online and plotted out milestones of the first time they took part in different online activities.
